April 18



WHAT IS THE MAIN FOCUS OF YOUR INTERNSHIP?

Experience and understanding. As I discern God's calling for me to be a pastor, this internship is helping me learn about the ministry first-hand and is also providing me with affirmation about my calling.

DESCRIBE YOUR MINDSET GOING INTO THE INTERNSHIP AS COMPARED TO NOW.

I was excited and also somewhat afraid going in. I was eager and open to what God wanted to show me, but I was also afraid to be far away from home for such a long period of time.

WHAT DOES YOUR INTERNSHIP CONSIST OF?

My internship consists mainly of coordinating the weekly Friday night

pancake and waffle ministry, as well as leading the church youth group. On Fridays we serve free pancakes and waffles for students and it is my job to organize and lead it. The same goes for the youth group, which has only been around for a few months. As we are connected to Eastern Michigan University (EMU), the primary focus is campus ministry.

DESCRIBE AN EXPERIENCE THAT HAS BEEN IMPACTFUL FOR YOU.

Early in my internship, Pastor Schindel, my father, and I attended a pastor's convention, and I was able to meet, listen to, and chat with so many different pastors. This was where my resolve towards pastoral ministry was not only strengthened, but was also confirmed.

WHAT SHOULD PEOPLE KNOW ABOUT THE PLACES YOU ARE WORKING WITH?

Cross and Resurrection is a very rare and unique environment because it is actually considered to be a campus chapel. As campus ministries are often neglected, through my time here, I have realized and seen just how important they really are.

THE SUMMER WAS FAR OUT WITH GOOD VIBES & SLAMMIN' DISCO.

The sound that defined the era came screaming out of stereos and record players in the form of Elton John, Joni Mitchell, BTO, Queen, Paul McCartney, and The Carpenters; all filling the airwaves while Hollywood delivered on the silver screen with films like Jaws and One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest. The world also continued to look on as The Cold War showed no sign of slowing, and The Vietnam War was finally brought to an end.

WELCOME TO SEPTEMBER, 1975.

In 1975, CLBI was expanding and student enrollment followed suit. As CLBI welcomed 135 students to campus that September (the average was around 45 students), unbeknownst to them at the time, it was in that year that CLBI would have the highest student numbers to date (as of 2022). What an amazing time to be a part of what God was doing through CLBI.

Welcome back to 2022.

NEARLY 50 YEARS LATER a lot has changed. The world is connected online, movies are streamed in the palm of our hands, and music from the 1990s is considered (sigh) "classic rock." Much has changed for CLBI as well.

For starters, this year we were blessed with 25 students, and the dream of discipleship continues through each one of them. Our campus has also continued to evolve, our program (including out-trips, cross-cultural experiences, and world class instructors) has provided students with incredible experiences, and our growing network of alumni and supporters has been committed to contributing towards what God is doing through this ministry. Gwynne, AB Currently a 1st Year Student at CLBI

"God works in mysterious ways. This year has been very influential in my walk with Christ. I can see Him at work all around me through the staff and students here. It is as if God has been refining me these past few months. Sending me through fire in order to bring me to a greater understanding of Him and also to show me that He is the one who refines. I cannot even attempt to refine myself on my own. God is the one who refines, and my hope is that He will bring the work that He has started in me to completion. God is on a mission here in Camrose and I hope that I can join Him on that mission as the year goes on."

SABRINA DICKENS

Alumni Saskatoon, SK Enrolled in Early Childhood Education Diploma Program (Saskatchewan Polytechnic)

"I often stop and look up to enjoy the sunsets. Saskatoon has a beautiful landscape for the sky. That is one way I see God on a daily basis in my city; through his creation. I work with children who are so simple and yet so profound, and Jesus calls us to love children and have child-like faith. To me that means asking him questions about my day or telling him about random things that happen at work. God delights in us when we come to him with everything and treat him like he is our best friend. I can definitely see God in my vocation."

TED HILL

Alumni, current staff Wetaskiwin, AB Program Director at CLBI

"As I have been reading through Hosea and finishing the Book of Acts over the past month, the sharpening awareness of Christ's mission in action is a continual working of the Holy Spirit. The book of Acts, at first glance, seems foreign. The prophet Hosea, at first glance, seems

cryptic and confusing. Both of these are calling us into and shaping the character of Christ's mission in us.

Last night I spent 2½ hours on Zoom with 6 men talking about the complexity of grief and the intensity of the emotion of anger. It is the 8th session of a 16-week Family Violence Treatment Program with Indigenous men as part of their probation conditions. I have been doing this since 2009, which is the year Jesus very actively shifted my self-driven desire towards the community of Maskwacis, where I wanted to be known as the pastor of two small churches that saved these people from chaos.

As I read God's desire for Hosea to understand the mess, pain and chaos of sin, Christ's mission in action in my life is about trusting in His purposeful grace working in those 2½ hour sessions every week. This is where God's salvation swells with healing hope as I place my hope in Jesus planting seeds on His field of mission."

JEREMY OSTERWALDER

Alumni, former staff Camrose, AB Pastor at Resurrection Lutheran in Camrose, AB & currently completing seminary studies at LB Seminary (Fergus Falls, MN)

"Having been immersed in the ministry of CLBI for 17 years, the focus of discipleship efforts through very particular activities became ingrained. The rhythm included worship, prayer, Bible study, one-on-one relationship and various experiential elements. All were designed to draw one another to Christ and into a space where the Holy Spirit

could shape each of us to be more like Christ. Working in parish ministry for the past 3½ years, I have been challenged to consider a new perspective on how God's work, through the means of grace, can be experienced by those who are not surrounded by an intentional Christian community. What remains central to Christ's mission being accomplished in our church family and in my personal life is the Word of God. It is God's Word which is both the catalyst and the sustainer which brings to completion Christ's call and mission."



KINDNESS PUTS HOPE IN THE WORLD, & HOPE GIVES ME GRATITUDE

Alumni Pincher Creek, AB Currently on long-term disability (was previously a Lutheran Pastor for 15 years)

"Personally, I believe in trying to reflect Christ as much as possible. I do this by being intentionally kind to people I see in businesses or just out and about. I do not just say hi, I focus on listening and being encouraging. I do not do it to specifically talk to people about Jesus, but it has led to that on several occasions. Kindness puts hope in the world, and hope gives me gratitude, which I need in my life. Being disabled is not easy, but God gives me strength by being kind to others."

These are just a few of the incredible individuals who have continued to learn and grow as disciples throughout their ordinary, and not so ordinary, life experiences. It is through the sharing of ourselves with one another that we inevitably grow as followers of Christ and gain strength to hold fast to this dream.

What started as a dream of a small group of Lutheran men and women has now become something so much greater. In the words of the late Ron Mayan (former CLBI President) in "Send Out Your Light":

"(CLBI) can and will be a special, life-enhancing place for many others still to come - IF we continue to dare to hold fast to the dream, IF we continue to dare to pray and plan in the same spirit as our forebears. Will you hold fast to the dream and make it your priority?"

WHERE ARETHED NOW?

KATHY FALTIN ('73-'74)

My name is Kathy Faltin (Kvemshagen) and I attended CLBI for the 1973-1974 school year.

MY FIRST IMPRESSION OF CLBI was being surprised at how many American students were attending that year (especially at a Canadian Bible College). It was also something of a fashion education for me to see what they were wearing: blue denim bib overalls over top of Stanfield long johns (complete with a trap door)

and "Earth shoes" on their feet. That kind of haute couture was not something I, nor the other Canadian kids, had been exposed to in our 18 years of life. It made such an impression on us that within a few months we were hunting for Stanfield's underwear and bib overalls at the Army and Navy store in Edmonton.

More than that, as the year went on I was struck by the depth of the faith our American friends had and how

much they wanted to grow in their spiritual lives. For me, I had always grown up in the church but found that CLBI helped me put some real foundations under my faith on a personal level. So much so that when our 3 children graduated from high school I wanted that for all of them (as did my husband Karl, who attended CLBI a couple of years after I did). So when our kids expressed interest in attending CLBI, we did all we could to encourage and support them in that. In the end, all three did attend and it was a tremendous blessing for them as well. All of them were strengthened in their faith, developed deep life-long friendships, and in the case of our daughter, even met her future husband.

After moving to Stettler in 1994, I moved on from my years of teaching junior high math, which believe it or not. I found to be a lot of fun and very fulfilling. My students were my second family of kids.

SINCE 2018 I have been retired, as is Karl, and we still live here in Stettler, Alberta. After retiring, I briefly took on a substitute teacher role at the same school I previously worked at. up until my grandchildren came along (grandma duty calls). Karl and I find that chasing after them is more than a full-time job, but even more incredibly fun and fulfilling.

These days, I serve on a few boards, love reading mystery novels, watching Masterpiece Theatre

on PBS, enjoy taking part in Bible studies, playing board games with family and friends, and spend time with my children and grandchildren. As I look back at my time at CLBI, I can see now that I was learning how much richer every aspect of our lives is when Christ is at the center of all we do, and I have certainly experienced that in my life.


